bership chair person is that I get to look over the long list of people past and present almost every day. Every time I play with the database and see a whole page of your interests and club history a mental picture pops into my head. I remember John Kasten helping me with a casting line problem on my first visit to Lake Murray 15 or 16 years ago. It was 5 years or more before I joined the club. I had read a magazine on how to make a loop connection by folding over the tip of the fly line and whip finishing the tag end. I now had a level 6 wt floating line with a heavy sinker on the end. I would cast it out and the leader would fall back on top of itself. I was very frustrated because I had fished many years without that problem and I thought I was just out of practice.

John came up, recognized the problem and told me "You need to cut that damn thing off your line or get a tapered fly line." John is a fine gentleman, but he tells it like it is. I went down to Bill and Eileen for a double tapered Cortland 333 fly line the next Tuesday. I have been going into Strouds since I moved to San Diego. If I was feeling homesick and missed my mother and father, I would visit Bill and Eileen. Fishing and talking about fishing with Bill and his customers is comforting to me. The Sunday Casting group has become a sanctuary for many members. Ned, Ken, Marvin, Flovd, and Lee have been wonderful instructors. I can remember Ken trying to change me from a gentle east coast "Fly Flicker" to a distance caster. I was working on my double haul and it was still not going anywhere. That was 10 years ago, but I remember it like it was yesterday. FLY OF THE MONTH

Skip Nymph - by Skip Morris, Best of a GRE and Pheasant tail





Hook: 14-10 nymph
Thread: 6/0 black

Tail: Pheasant tail fibers
Body: Rabbit antron dubbing

Ribbing: Copper wire

Shellback: Pheasant tail fibers

Thorax: Rabbit antron dubbing well picked out (legs of partridge optional)

- Tie in pheasant tail fibers at bend of hook with several wraps of thread, and then pull butts back over tail and secure back with several more wraps of thread.
- 2. Tie in copper wire ribbing.
- 3. Dub antron dubbing on to thread and wrap forward about 3/4 the way up the hook shank.
- 4. Pull pheasant tail over body and secure with thread, do not trim butts, they will be used for wingcase.
- 5. Wrap copper wire over shellback and body and secure with thread and trim.

- 6. Pull the pheasant tail butts back and secure back with several wraps of thread.
- 7. Dub a generous amount of antron dubbing on to thread and wrap forward to eye. Make thorax thicker than abdomen.
- 8. Pull pheasant tail butts over thorax and secure with thread.
- 9. Trim, whip finish, and head cement

An alternative method is to tie the pheasant tail after the rib and body, then pull the wing case back to make the thorax.

SDFF Membership 2009 Trivia

Lucky thanks to all those that have paid their 2010 dues early; 48% of the memberships are in before Xmas. "How To"...SDFF Meeting Set-up and Breakdown 2010

SET UP

- > Arrive by 6:30 PM
- ➤ Unlock SDFF cabinets (located on stage left) combination lock #1-2-3
- > Carry name-tag cases to back of auditorium. Cases are located adjacent to cabinets
- > Someone is usually there by 6:00 PM to set up condiment table and start coffee
- ➤ Move salad bar tables flat against the wall (if they are set up)
- > Set up tables next to back windows for name tag boxes
- > Arrange table for raffle ticket sales
- ➤ Arrange 2-3 tables in front of stage steps for raffle items
- > Set up club P.A. system (found in cabinets on stage)
- > Set up slide projector (extension cord in cabinet) and pull down screen in back of stage
- Make sure faculty restrooms are unlocked and hall lights are on (see custodian)
- > Check with custodian about heater for auditorium if needed
- ➤ Put out large trash cans and recycle bin (from teacher's lounge)
- > Set up 10 rows of 10 chairs (5 chairs on each side of aisle)

BREAKDOWN

- > Be sure all chairs and tables are returned to original positions
- > Check and clean up trash, spills, and crumbs
- > Turn off and put away microphone, screen and projector
- > Return coffee pot, condiment box, blue bin, and name tag boxes to cabinet. LOCK CABINET!
- > Custodian is responsible for shutting down and locking up, but please double check any windows that may have been opened.

It is important that we return this room to the same order as we found it as the school uses this room first thing in the morning and they have no time to rearrange before the kids arrive.


