

## Lost Fishing Areas and Access Reductions in San Diego County

Some notes by Louie Zimm to Lucky Ketcham and Steve Piper December 7, 2011

Steve Piper and I were writing back and forth about the areas around Scripps Pier that we will no longer be able to fish on January 1st, 2012. I knew I would no longer be able to fish south and north of the pier but I did not realize I would also lose the croaker hole at the bottom of the lifeguard access road, Black Gold Road.

Final for Blacks seems to be closed to all shore fishing up to 32 deg 53.0 min N, 117 deg 15.166min W (south boundary is at 32 deg 51.964 min N) Steve plotted the GPS point to be half way to the Glider Port "goat trail" and the black asphalt road to the beach. I have walked that road many, many times in the past 30 years. The big croaker hole at the bottom of the road has produced many of my legal surf halibut and hundreds of perch and yellow fin croaker. I will surely miss it.

Google maps puts that about 1/2 way between the Black Gold road (asphalt road to surf beach) and the Glider Port trail.

Louie Zimm clarifies many of the areas we will not be able to fish in 2012:

When the MLPA closures go into effect in January 1, 2012 the closure will be from Goldfish Point, Point La Jolla all the way to the North edge of UCSD land, which is

just south of the glider port trail.

Also from 2 blocks north of Crystal Pier to Palomar Street (Big Rock Reef). The only part of La Jolla that you will be able to beach fish in La Jolla will be from Palomar Street/ Big Rock Reef to Goldfish Point and from the glider port north.

I warned you all that it would be bad!

Already, one of the Mission Bay based Seaforth 1/2 day boats has moved to San Diego Bay in response. However, now we are faced with a \$30 dollar daily Mexican visa charge.

Let's see, since 9/11, we have lost:

-30% of San Diego Bay,

-the 43 Fathom Bank,

-the 60 Mile Bank,

-much of San Clemente Island,

-40% of the rocky coastal habitat in So Cal

-the Cortez and Tanner Bank deeper then 20 Fathoms (120 feet) -and perhaps access to Mexican waters

-plus much of the San Diego County surf fishing beaches including La Jolla Shores.

-Black's and Border Field,/Tijuana River-mouth.

Hmmm... think we have an access problem?

This could be the end of fishing in So Cal as we know it. 30% of San Diego Bay is off limits to fishing: Louie explains:

After 9/11 one cannot fish within 100 yards of any federal or navy installation. Thus we lost the whole coast of North Island, off all the naw involved shipyards, all of 32<sup>nd</sup> street naval base, all of the carrier pier area, all of the sub base, the bait barge, amphib base, off the seal training area, within 100 yards of the Coast Guard Base, also the Admiral Kidd club side of the entrance to NTC channel and the east side of the commercial basin. Also a large area in the ocean off the firing range south of North Island as well as any beach areas between

the Coronado Hotel and Imperial Beach.

Don't forget that one is prohibited from stopping or fishing with 75 feet of the Coronado Bridge. Also don't forget that one has always been prohibited from anchoring and/of fishing within the shipping channel. Also one cannot come within 100 yards of any cruise ship or naval vessel. 

indefinitely as part of the implementation of the Marine Life Protection Act (MLPA). The closures will be reviewed every 5 years, but given the scarcity of fish population data and of funding to generate more data, it is likely that these areas will be closed for at least a decade and probably more.

Both Scripps and Blacks up past the lifeguard road almost to the glider port trail will be closed as part of a new Marine Protection Area (MPA). I have enjoyed fly fishing Scripps and Blacks for the last 10 years. Both spots have given up nice perch, corbina, spotfin yellowfin croakers, and halibut.

Scripps could be magical in the early evening for corbina and yellowfin croaker, and Blacks was good for many nice mornings as well as for sight fishing to corbina in the middle of the day.

At Scripps, you can park along the coastal road south of the campus, on Paseo Grande, and walk down the southern stairs to the beach.

At Blacks, you can park on Black Gold Road, and walk down the asphalt Lifeguard road.

## "How To"...SDFF Meeting Set-up and Breakdown 2012

#### **SET UP**

- > Arrive by 6:30 PM
- ➤ Unlock SDFF cabinets (located on stage left) combination lock # 1-2-3
- > Carry name-tag cases to back of auditorium. Cases are located adjacent to cabinets
- > Someone is usually there by 6:00 PM to set up condiment table and start coffee
- Move salad bar tables flat against the wall (if they are set up)
- > Set up tables next to back windows for name tag boxes
- > Arrange table for raffle ticket sales
- > Arrange 1 table for door prizes
- > Set up club P.A. system (found in cabinets on stage)
- > Set up table for projectors, extension cord in cabinet and pull down screen in back of stage
- Make sure faculty restrooms are unlocked and hall lights are on (see custodian)
- > Check with custodian about heater for auditorium if needed
- > Put out large trash cans and recycle bin (from teacher's lounge)
- > Set up 10 rows of 10 chairs (5 chairs on each side of aisle)

#### **BREAKDOWN**

- > Be sure all chairs and tables are returned to original positions
- > Check and clean up trash, spills, and crumbs
- > Turn off and put away microphone, screen and projector

- . Teaching communication skills




