Save the Date! - Surf Fishing Clinic

San Diego Fly Fishers will be having a Surf Fishing Clinic on Saturday, August 2. To take advantage of the tides, we'll be meeting early at 7:00 AM at Torrey Pines State Beach. Park on N. Torrey Pines Rd. and meet at Life Guard Station No. 3, just north of the parking lot. Items to bring if you have them are: 6 to 8 wt. rod with corresponding sinking shooting head, straight 6 - 8 lb. mono or fluoro leader material, stripping basket, waders and flats booties (if fishing dry – otherwise swim wear) and size 6 - 4 clouser minnows or sand crab flies. If you don't have these, bring your stoutest trout rod preferably with a sinking or sink tip line. One of the largest halibut I've seen caught was on a 5 wt. trout rod! We'll review equipment, reading water and of course catching fish! If you plan to attend, please contact Jon Hee at

releasing any number of feisty rainbows, all at least 18" long. When Marv arrived, it was raining steadily and I found out that it had been doing this on and off for 6 days! In other words, it was a crapshoot that we even got to launch the drift boat. Incidentally, McKenzie drift boats were invented in the early 1940's to fish this river and

the severe rocker is a design feature that enables swift and easy maneuvering of the boat. Anyway, we DID launch and found a nice gravel bar to anchor up on while we rigged up with flies that looked something like large Prince nymphs. I tried a few drifts but it soon became

apparent that even with a sink tip, the river was flowing too high and too fast to get either depth or a drag-free float. As we travelled down the river, we found a few backwaters that looked promising; only to discover a lot of tree debris blocked either the entrance to or the exit from the backwater. One backwater was so strong that it fed a

recently-constructed irrigation canal. And so it went for the rest of the day....we drifted at an excessive rate and no matter what line or fly we threw, we had no takes. We did see some birds, trees flashing by like a picket fence and the first osprey and bald eagle of the season. Meanwhile, Mother Nature decided to increase the rain to a small deluge, followed by a lot of hail. You had to laugh; the alternative was worse. In fact, I had Marv take a picture of me in the hail. Mary proved the consummate host and had made lunch/drinks for us. We dined well and he brought freshly-smoked steelhead as an appetizer. Although the fishing was poor, the day went "swimmingly" and I sure hope to be able to fish there again under drier conditions. Many thanks to those who replied to my request and a special thanks to Mary Clemons for a great day on the water.

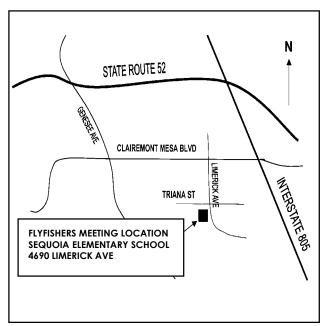
