





Crowley Lake 9/23/15

Back in the saddle again! Crowley is really fishing well. McGee Bay and the North Arm continue to kick out some really nice fish. If you ever have wanted to fish Crowley, this fall will be a memorable one, hands down. Streamer fishing is picking up as the lake level drops and defines the weed lines. Intermediate full sinks, or heavier sinking tips are the right lines to cast Loebergs & Punk Perch patterns along the weed lines; or in the larger "pockets". Chironomid hatches will remain strong during periods of high pressure. Gillies & crystal mergers, & midge pupa patterns

are good calls as the upper flies during hatches. Twin gillies, or a broken back gillie as the upper- along with dark zebras, copper tiger midges, BB tigers and zebras will get you take downs during pupal ascents. If you locate some clean water along the weeds, try an assassin, punk perch, or crystal leech as your upper fly.

Middle Owens River (Bishop area) 9/23/15

Upper Owens/ McGee Creek 9/23/15

Water levels have been very consistent for the last week. Flows remain low; but very fishable. Dry/dropper techniques are the way to go here. Conditions remain good here with a few larger fish moving up from Crowley. A few nice cutty's & browns in the deeper holes. The sections up from Benton Crossing are much better. You can get into a few decent browns on caddis, and last generation BWO adults at times. Some larger browns hitting crystal leeches fished with a sink tip in the deepest pools. Stimulators, hi-vis caddis, & natural caddis are good calls for dry flies. I like a tandem nymph rig in the deeper pools using an assassin, FB PT, or crystal leech as the upper-put an egg, or smaller Assassin as the dropper. Fly of the Month

Patriot Double Wing

This fly combines the attraction of Charlie Meck's "Patriot" with a Gary LaFontaine favorite "Double Wing." Bob Pharoah has been reading Gary's book, The Dry Fly – New Angles and suggests we try some of these patterns. Book says an attractor is often the best fly choice when fishing a river from a pontoon or drift boat. A fish only sees the fly once. A realistic fly is a good choice when the fish will see the pattern several times.

Supplies

Hook: Dry Fly Hook, 2XLong. 2XFine, TMC 5212, Mustad 94831, size 10 to 18. Thread: Red (Uni) 3/0 for #8 -10, 6/0 for #12-14, 8/0 for #16 - 18				
Tail:	Brown Antron stub			
Tag:	Blue Krystal Flash			
Rear Wing:	Medium brown to dark tan deer/elk body hair. Use fine coastal deer hair or			
elk hock for small patterns,				
Body:	Red Antron dubbing			
Body Hackle:	Furnace brown – only 1 hook gap length fibers			
Front Wing:	White calf tail, kip.			
Hackle: Coachman Brown, dry fly quality, longer than body hackle.				
DIRECTIONS				

• Place hook in vise and attach thread to cover the rear 2/3 of the hook shank. Bring thread over the hook barb to start.

•

• Tie in a short tail of brown Antron. Make it no longer than the gap of the hook, shorter is better, as it is a stub tail. Comb out the tail as needed.

•

- Wrap a short section of the rear of the shank with several strands of blue floss to form the tip. End just beyond the barb of the hook and before the point.
 Stack and tie in the rear wing of deer hair, making sure it is even with the end of the tail.
- Tie in the body hackle. Touch dub a body of red Antron leaving the front 1/4 of the shank for the front wing, hackle, and head of the fly. (Touch dubbing is used with Antron yarn that has been clipped into very short sections (1/8") and just touched to the tacky wax on a thread. It produces a

spiky air bubble holding body that Gary La Fontaine likes on his caddis patterns. Do not compress it as you would with a standard rope dubbing technique. LK)

- Palmer the body hackle evenly forward over the touch dubbed body, tie it off, and clip flat top and bottom.
- Stack and tie in the front wing of calf tail so that it extends over the entire fly, making sure it is even with the end of the rear wing and tail.
- Wrap a full head hackle and whipfinish the head.
- Gary LaFontaine recommends eight color variations and suggests the best light conditions for these attractors. Brown = early evening; Gray = overcast days; Lime = afternoon; Orange = dusk; Pink Lady = early morning;

Royal = brightest sun with glare on water; White = shaded areas; Yellow = midday. (from p. 168 of <u>Trout Flies</u>)

I you like the Patriot, you might like to try the Patriot Double Wing.

How does Cuyamaca Lake "gauge" the rainfall?

In answering a friend's question (shown above) I'll try to answer the best I can without making things too confusing....it is for me, but I am easily confused. It's a good question that deserves an explanation and answer. Straight up, yes, the dam has equipment to measure the number of inches of precipitation and a gauging board to tell how much water is in the lake.

If you mean how many acre feet did the lake come up with during the last storm?....well, sort of. There is a gauging board attached to the tower at the dam. Lake Cuyamaca is a very shallow lake. Right now, at that reading, we have 408.2 acre-feet of water. When the lake is full, the reading should be 25.8 or 6,425.8' above sea level and would equal 889.5 acre feet of water. So, we are close to 5' below full and at about 47% of capacity (not even half full) and in need of an additional 481.3 are feet of water to be full. This last storm (July 2015 when this article was written)

left us with .68"-(or a little more than half





results scary leaving us with about 255 acre feet by that date, or around 27% of full. Of course the evaporation rate will subside somewhat as the surface area of the lake diminishes, but I can't factor that in to the equation.

In San Diego County, Lake Cuvamaca, and a handful of other lakes, are different in that they don't get their water, or even part of their water, from the Colorado River. We are "landlocked" and depend on the seasonal precipitation (for the most part) to fill our lake. We don't get the guagga infestation, but this opens up a whole new world because we don't get the consistent flushing other lakes get during the evaporative period of the year. And because of this, we deal with things like green algae, blue

Trout in the Classroom Teacher Workshop



Trout in the Classroom (TIC) is a community-based program which allows students to experience first-hand the value of aquatic environments and the balance that must be met to maintain and preserve California's fisheries and aquatic habitats. This is a hands-on, interdisciplinary project for grades K-12 and that is run cooperatively by local schools, fishing clubs and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW).

Using eggs provided by a CDFW hatchery, teachers and their students set up an aquarium in the classroom, receive trout eggs under a special CDFW permit, and observe the life cycle as the fish hatch and develop. The experience may culminate in a field trip a local lake where the trout are released.

Completion of a training workshop is required of all teachers in order to receive eggs. An upcoming workshop will be held at CDFW's Upper Newport Back Bay Science Center. To register or for more information, please contact Jennifer O'Brien at iennifer.obrien@wildlife.ca.gov


