There were three fish caught. Kai: "I was fishing the arm straight across from the launch, a very slight breeze gave me a slow drift up the arm. Not getting any bites close to the reeds so I peddled back out to the main lake and drifted back up the middle of the arm in deeper water. I was fishing a size 14 copper bead head nymph, olive with sili legs with a sink tip section on my floating line, no indicator. About midway into the drift, I started getting bites. Of the 6-8 bites I got (one of them a really big one that didn't stick) I picked up two sunfish. Across the lake a bass was caught, but I don't know on what."

Fly of the Month



A bright red bag of Crunchy Cheetos was the inspiration for this English Buzzer midge.

Recipe:	Hook TMC200R size 16 or 14
Thread:	8/0 black and 200 denier for under body.
Rib:	fine gold wire
Cheeks:	Thin triangles cut from the Cheetos bag
Coating:	Loon Thick UV cure resin.

I used two thread bobbins in making this fly. The thick flat waxed nylon makes a good underbody to create the midge pupa shape without wasting my 8/0 black thread. Wrap the underbody and tie in 4 inches of gold wire at the bend.

Begin wrapping the black thread to completely cover the red thread. Spiral wrap the gold wire to form segments. Tie off wire at the 3/4 shank mark.

Now cut two small thin triangles from the bag, about as wide and long as a goose biot. They must be narrower than the thorax of the midge. Tie in each triangle by the points on each side, wide part of triangle to the rear. The bright red color should be against the body. It will be exposed when you pull it forward and tie down behind the eye. Trim any excess bag. Whip finish.

Now use Loon Thick UV resin to clear coat the body. Use the UV Flashlight to cure.

Conservation & Education

In early November we were camping at Lake Cuyamaca and I checked in with Butch Paddock, the managing ranger at the Lake to see how his hatchery project was going. A couple of years ago Butch was frustrated with the high cost of stocked trout from California DFW. Traditional levels of stocking "catchable" size trout had become cost prohibitive. So, a closing tackle shop in Lakeside donated their old fish tanks, and Butch set them up in the Lake's old boathouse to raise some fingerlings. It worked out pretty well. SDFF donated \$1000 to support the project and our volunteers built a feeding pen to grow the fish before release. Butch soon realized that buying eggs was much cheaper than buying fingerlings, and had great success raising them. 38,000 pounds of healthy trout have been added to the Lake each year.

When I was there most of the tanks had been emptied to the feeding pens and prepared for a new batch of trout. 25,000 fertilized eggs arrived on Nov 12 from a commercial hatchery in Washington State and placed in the "McDonald Hatching Jar" you see in the picture (right). Water flows up though the eggs, so when they hatch, the baby fish can swim up and out the chute into the tank. That should happen within 7 to 10 days. The baby fish called "alevin" live off of the nutrients in their attached egg sack until they begin feeding in about 2 weeks. If you would like to learn more, when things get back to normal, join us on our Trout in the Classroom project and watch trout hatch while you help the students learn about trout and clean waters.

On a recent vacation Butch visited some other hatcheries and brought back 900 Florida strain largemouth bass fingerlings and some baby crappie. He is raising them in another tank for release next spring/summer. Our local DFW lake fisheries biologist Matt Lucero, who spoke with us at our October meeting has been very supportive of Butch and his Lake Cuyamaca hatchery project. Like us, he is very



pleased with the results. We plan to continue donating financial and volunteer support for this project.

If you would like to see your conservation \$\$\$ at work, take the scenic drive up to Lake Cuyamaca. If one of the staff is available around the boat house, tell them you are from San Diego Fly Fishers and ask to see the hatchery. You may also walk down on the boat rental dock and see the feeding pens. Then go catch some fish!
